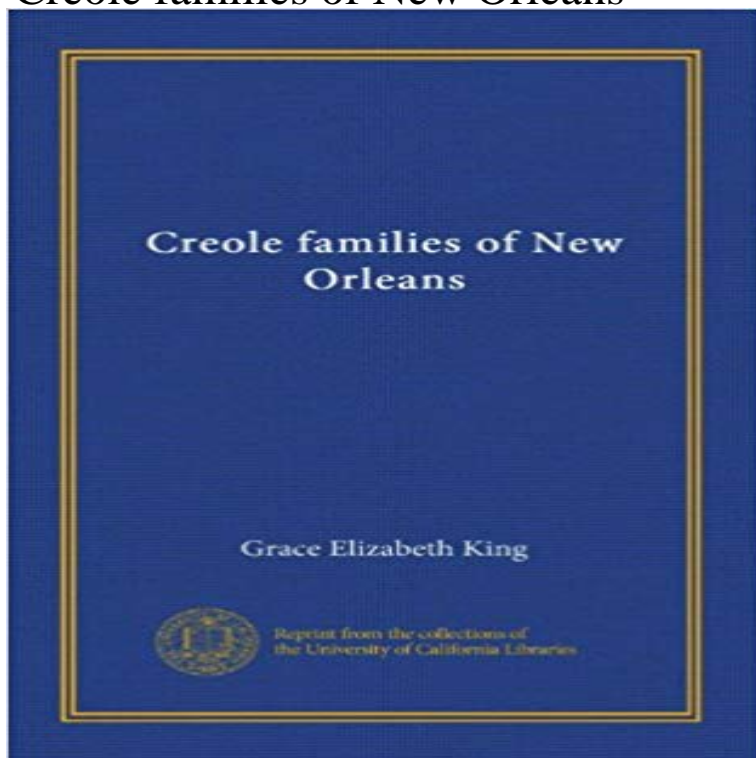


Creole families of New Orleans
